With 39 total vessel movements scheduled in the ports for Saturday and Sunday it promises to be another busy weekend. Sufficient pilots are available for scheduled vessel movements, and once again the challenge will be to keep the landside movements flowing smoothly.

Patrick has already released extra slots this morning for the weekend and is looking for a good take-up of these. DP World has also reported favourable truck turnaround times on weekends, something we urge the trucking industry to utilise.

Another initiative introduced by Patrick is a webcam, which enables you to view live, via the web, the status of trucks and queues at the entrance to their terminal.

Sydney Ports has supported this initiative with the commencement of a trial *Truckcam* to monitor queues at the DP World entrance.
