# National identification system to strengthen maritime security



A new, nationally recognised identification card for maritime industry workers will be issued under strengthened maritime security laws designed to protect Australia's ports, ships and offshore oil and gas facilities.

The Maritime Security Identification Card (MSIC) scheme is part of a \$150 million Australian Government investment to secure the maritime industry from threats of terrorism and other unlawful acts.

The Department of Transport and Regional Services is managing the introduction of the card and the implementation of the legislation.

You will need an MSIC if you work in a maritime security zone, on a wharf, onboard a ship, or onboard an offshore oil or gas facility. You will also need an MSIC if you visit an Australian regulated port, ship or offshore facility more than once a year to pick up or drop off goods, provide services or conduct regular maintenance.

About 130,000 of the cards will be issued around Australia by the end of 2006, in preparation for the scheme's full introduction by 1 January 2007.

The changes follow a year-long collaboration between the Australian Government and the maritime industry and other key affected stakeholder groups to develop the MSIC scheme.

Applying for an MSIC means you will need to undergo background checks – these checks will be done by Australian Government agencies such as ASIO and the Australian Federal Police and coordinated by the Department of Transport and Regional Services.

Every worker must complete this criminal history check and security assessment before an MSIC is issued.



The Department of Transport and Regional Services has set up an MSIC designated call centre to answer questions about maritime security identification cards (MSICs) and the background checking process. Call them on **1800 052 002** between 8.00am and 8.00pm, local time.
